

- 4. Refer to the graph above. Assume that the government has imposed a \$3.15 tax on each unit sold.
 - a. Calculate the tax revenues received by the government.
 - b. Calculate the new consumer surplus with the tax.
 - c. Calculate the new producer surplus with the tax.
 - d. Calculate the deadweight loss with the tax.
